

Organizational Markers for the Classroom

Organizational markers such as these will help your listeners follow the content you present.

<u>To introduce a topic:</u> Today we're going to look at/examine… In today's lab we're going to… because…	Today I'm going to explain
<u>To emphasize important info:</u> From this we learn… Note that… The main thing to understand is…	Notice that Remember,
<u>To change a topic (while lecturing):</u> Moving on, … Next,… Okay. Let's move on to…	
<u>To clarify:</u> That is to say, This means V	Vhat this means is In other words,
To check for comprehension:Am I making myself clear?Are you following what I'm saying?Is everyone following?	
<u>To seek clarification when not understanding a student's question or comment:</u> Let's see if I understood your question. (<i>Then repeat it as you understood it.)</i> Can you repeat the (first, last) part of your question, please?	
<u>To interrupt:</u> Excuse me. Sorry to interrupt, but	
<u>To get students' attention after group work:</u> Can I get your attention please?	All right, everyone.
<u>To redirect students if they get off-topic:</u> Getting back to (topic X), Are you still discussing (topic X)?	It sounds like you might be off topic. Do you have questions about (topic X)?
<u>To check their understanding of your answer</u> Did I answer your question? Does that help?	<u>er to a question:</u> Is that what you were asking for? Is that what you wanted to know?
<u>To conclude:</u> To conclude, To summarize,	So let me summarize what we have covered.
